
A Campaign to Support Our Chaplain Program


Chaplains provide safe, whole family support.

Cindy Martin and her mom, Judith, met Chaplain Cindy Simpson in 2021, two days after Judith moved into Someren Glen. Last December, Judith and her family learned that her lung cancer had returned. It was difficult and overwhelming. Chaplain Cindy stepped in right away to support them in whatever way they needed.

Cindy and her family are so grateful for the support they got from the entire team at Someren Glen, but especially from Chaplain Cindy. She hopes that other families and residents know what a CLC Chaplain is: "A safe person, a safe place, to share their feelings and what their needs are. Not to think that nobody wants to listen to them. There is somebody there that will do that."

What does the future look like?

Jim Kok shares, "I dream about a bright future for the Chaplain Services team, with the ability to enrich the lives of even more residents, families, and team members in more CLC neighborhoods and communities."



Ensuring the support of professionals in our communities is a priority. CLC currently funds full-time and part-time chaplains. To match the increasing needs of residents, families, and team members, we will raise additional funding to increase chaplain hours and accessibility.

Library Project Inspires Community at Dayspring Villa

With just two bookshelves and outdated books, the library at Dayspring Villa wasn't a very welcoming space. Unfortunately, there are few resources available to make improvements - 90% of residents who live in this assisted living community in west Denver utilize Medicaid to help pay for their care.

A group of residents took on the challenge to raise funds to upgrade the library. They decided to host an Art Show and spent months creating beautiful art to sell. To encourage their efforts, CLC promised to match what was raised up to \$2,500 from the General Mission Fund. Promoting autonomy and enrichment are part of the CLC mission, and the Dayspring library project fit the bill.

Caring community partners offered raffle items, bought art, and made gifts to the library. Duet Dining provided a cheese board and wine tasting for Art Show patrons. With everyone's combined kindness and generosity, residents raised more than \$1,600.

Richard Raisch, a resident and lifelong builder of model trains, generously donated a handmade

trainset. "When you see something that needs to be done. and you're capable of doing it, then I think you have a social responsibility to do it," Richard shared. This unique piece sold at CLC's annual event, *Aged* to Perfection, raising another \$550.

With the General Mission match, the community had

approximately \$5,000 to remodel the library.

Richard formed a Library Advisory Board (LAB) of residents who loved books and were willing to volunteer. Former Librarian and resident Diana

Bennett stepped up to help. "We wanted to make something that was more useable and more appropriate for what people need," she said.

A survey found out what authors and genres residents liked. "We were just amazed," said LAB member and resident Frankie Holder. "We found more people were interested than maybe we had thought that there was going to be."

The LAB purchased five stylish bookshelves that Richard and his daughter spent two days putting together. "I can do a lot of things that most people cannot do," he said. "And I feel that I owe it to the community to use those talents. Putting bookcases together was one thing that I can do."

Resident librarians from Dayspring's sister community, Someren Glen, sent over books for the new shelves.

The impact has been transformative. "I've noticed people that I've never seen look at books before, come and look at books," says Diana. "The way we've created the space, it's very functional for people to sit and talk."

Frankie agrees: "They like the space, they like the way the books look. Now people really sit out there and exchange ideas and all that. It's a real welcoming place."

The LAB has big plans for the future of the library, including adding large-print books so that residents living with

low vision can use the library, too. Securing increasingly more expensive newspaper subscriptions is also on the future plans wish list.
